WITHDRAWN LOTS: 69, 102, 500

Lot 71: This medal appears to have been granted to Hercules Pakenham (1859-1877), the only son of Thomas S Pakenham, JP, and not as stated in the printed catalogue. The note should read: The Royal Humane Society bronze medal was introduced in 1837. It is awarded to people who have put their own lives at great risk to save or attempt to save someone else.

Awarded to Thomas Hercules Pakenham (1859-1877), son of Lieutenant-General Thomas Henry Pakenham CB DL JP (1826 -1913) who was was a Unionist MP for Antrim and a British Army officer, and a member of the Pakenham family headed by the Earl of Longford.

Lot 118 should read: South Africa 'Zulu' or 'Kaffir' Wars medal, 1877-1878 with 1879 bar to a soldier in the 94th Regiment (later part of the Connaught Rangers).

Lot 136 should read: **1914 Bluecloth helmet in its original barracks issue wooden box.** Lacking badge and spike, with brass chin strap, rose motif strap hooks, stamped 'WD 4 1914'. Box with faint inscription 'J. Lee'
A few stains to cloth, **good.**

Lot 188. Serial number 14466. Also stamped 14 R.R. 18

Lot 224: Description should read "one hundred euro"

Lot 350 should read: 1939 pattern Garda Síochána helmet. Registration number 11856. With Dublin Metropolitan Police type shamrock motif fasteners added.

Lot 410. The badge is a cap badge adapted for the helmet and not the proper helmet issue badge.

Lot 423 comprises 4 items, to also include a SA pin.

Lot 431: the decals may not belong.

Lot 434A: estimate should read €500-€700

Lot 434B: estimate should read €300-€500

Lot 434C: estimate should read €300-€500

Lot 434 D: estimate should read €500-€700

Lot 510: Description should read: "We Men of the North had a word..."

Lot 583 does NOT include a Guernsey gold coin. Description reads: Includes commemorative silver coins, UK with Britannia set, Millennium silver collection, Queen Mother £5 and £5 note, Royal Mint Solomn Islands bimetal coins, UK Victoria double florin, various Dublin Mint medallions including Michael Collins, ranges of USA and various European countries..

Lot 666 should read: Includes Ten Shillings 12-9-51, 7-10-65, 6-6-68 (3), Five Pounds 8-1-48, 20-6-63, 12-5-69, 26-5-74 (2), 5-9-75 (2), 10-1-75 (2), Ten Pounds 15-5-57, Fifty Pounds 4-4-77. Also Ten Shillings 6-6-68 (16 in poor condition)

Lot 717 should read: GAA football All-Ireland final programmes for 1956 Cork v Galway and 1957 Cork v Louth.

Lot 738: Description should read: GAA Hurling. A hurley signed by the Wexford team, Leinster champions 2004. They beat Kilkenny in the 2004 semi final with a last minute goal, ending Kilkenny's run of 6 Leinster titles in a row. Had Kilkenny won the Leinster title in 2004, they would have won an unprecedented 14 Leinster championships in a row.

769 should read: Boxing: 1974 Ali v Frazier autographed gloves in a presentation frame with original fight programmes.
